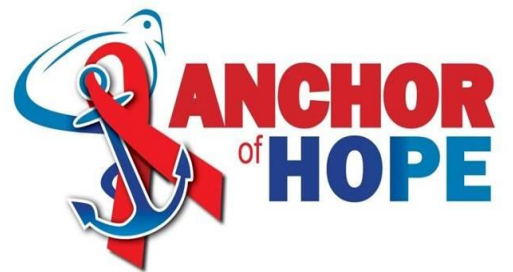


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INTRODUCTION

Anchor of Hope is an umbrella registered non profitable organisation, no 67556, whose ultimate goal is to restore dignity to vulnerable people - irrespective of age, gender, ability, political background or race. This is achieved by providing clothing and non-perishable food to needy families via a network of organisations, projects, feeding schemes, counselling, awareness programs, pregnancy home, a men's upliftment home, life skills training and job preparation and creation projects.

Each of the divisions concentrate on it's own field of expertise within the community of Bloemfontein and surrounding areas. The focus area of the different divisions are as follows:

1. Anchor of Hope – Projects : Food and clothing to the poor and other organizations, support of feeding schemes, community and social upliftment programs with government institutions and other organizations.
2. Pregnancy Crisis Centre of Hope: Is a centre and home that gives hope to every mother that have an unplanned or unwanted pregnancy – who feels desperate, confused, ashamed and who needs spiritual, emotional and mental guidance. Pre and post abortion counseling, information sessions at tertiary institutions, training for counselors and temporary accommodation for pregnant mothers and new-born babies are services offered at the center.
3. Anchor of Rest - A factory making furniture and doing upholstery of the highest quality and standard through training and mentorship with previously unemployed people. Making something out of nothing creates pride and the ability within people that unlocks their hidden potential.
4. Lighthouse Upliftment Centre – A men's shelter that focus on the restoration and rehabilitation of hopeless and broken men living in the streets through love, understanding, counseling and job creation programs.
5. Esther – Is a project that focus on broken and hopeless women and young girls. Dignity, hope and worthiness is established through our job creation project where washable sanitary towels are made and then distributed among girls who cannot afford it.
6. Streets of Hope – Is a project whereby we use unemployed to clean streets, cut grass, cut fire paths and pick up rubbish in and around businesses, neighborhoods and plots. In doing this we create work, giving people back their dignity and humanity, help with social upliftment AND create a clean environment what communities can be proud off.
7. POPUP - POPUP's vision is to transform lives and uplift individuals to impact their world. We firmly believe that transformation takes place from a holistic point of view, impacting the heart and mind of the person in such a way as to transform them from the inside out, resulting in a changed person who can positively impact their immediate surroundings; their households, extended families, communities and the country at large

Our organization is also a registered Article 18(A) organization which is to the benefit off all who donate. Our audited financial statements will be available on request.


The organisation has been known to me since 2013 when we started working together in distributing food and clothes to the needy in the Free State communities.

CONTINUOUS PROJECTS

OPERATION

A) Schools: Anchor of Hope support 2 daycares with about 160 children in phase 3 and 5. We give them maize once a month. We also give them clothes and bedding as needed.

B) Churches: We support churches in the township with food, clothes, bedding and kitchenware. We also support 3 churches in the city with food and clothes.

C) Food and Clothing Bank: The clothing bank where we have 20 000-25000 pieces of clothes at any given time which we give to the poor and other organizations in need. We also have beds, bedding, toys and some furniture which we give to those in need. We plan to centralize all clothing banks in the city to eliminate clothing not used due to wrong sizes.

D) Other Organizations in Need: We assist 6 other organizations with clothes and food such as farm workers, safe houses, Children's homes, Baby houses, Government organizations.

E) School Program: This is a program which was taken over from KMD where we visit schools and talk to them about abstaining. During 2022 we visited 4 school on invitation and we had very good feedback. We are currently using a program called UNDILUTED which is approved by the Department of Education about sexuality.

F) Outreach Programs: We support 3 church groups in Bloemfontein to reach out in Bloemfontein, Botswana , Lesotho and Zimbabwe with food, Bibles, clothes and stationary for children.

G) Food of Hope – Food Parcel Project: *During 2022 we handed our 10 tons of maize and other food products to different organisations*

H) City Changer Project: In partnership with Doxa Deo Church public parks are maintained and children's play areas are painted.

FOOD AND CLOTHING BANK

OPERATION

The food and clothing center was established to centralise food and clothing centers in Bloemfontein as to reduce wastage and increase social impact. Hungry and cold people tend to turn to crime to satisfy their basic needs. We are currently situated in stores of 1600m² and we have a continuous balance of 10 000 - 15 000 pieces of clothes and 6 tons of maize. Included at the clothing bank is furniture, kitchenware, bedding, food, school clothes and stationary.

The primary objective of the bank is to help people in the most efficient and effective way and distribute all of the items we have in the store to those who are in need – in correct size and quantity. During the past few years we identified the following problems among most of the Non Profit Organisations:

- 1) Clothes are being delivered to them by individuals or organisations of which most of these clothes are of the wrong size, gender or unfit to wear,
- 2) Bedding, furniture and toys are delivered and most of these are not needed, or broken or dirty
- 3) Some organisations have an overflow of certain items whilst other organisations a shortfall.

In identifying these problems we decided to identify certain organisations and set up a food and clothing center that will breach these problems.

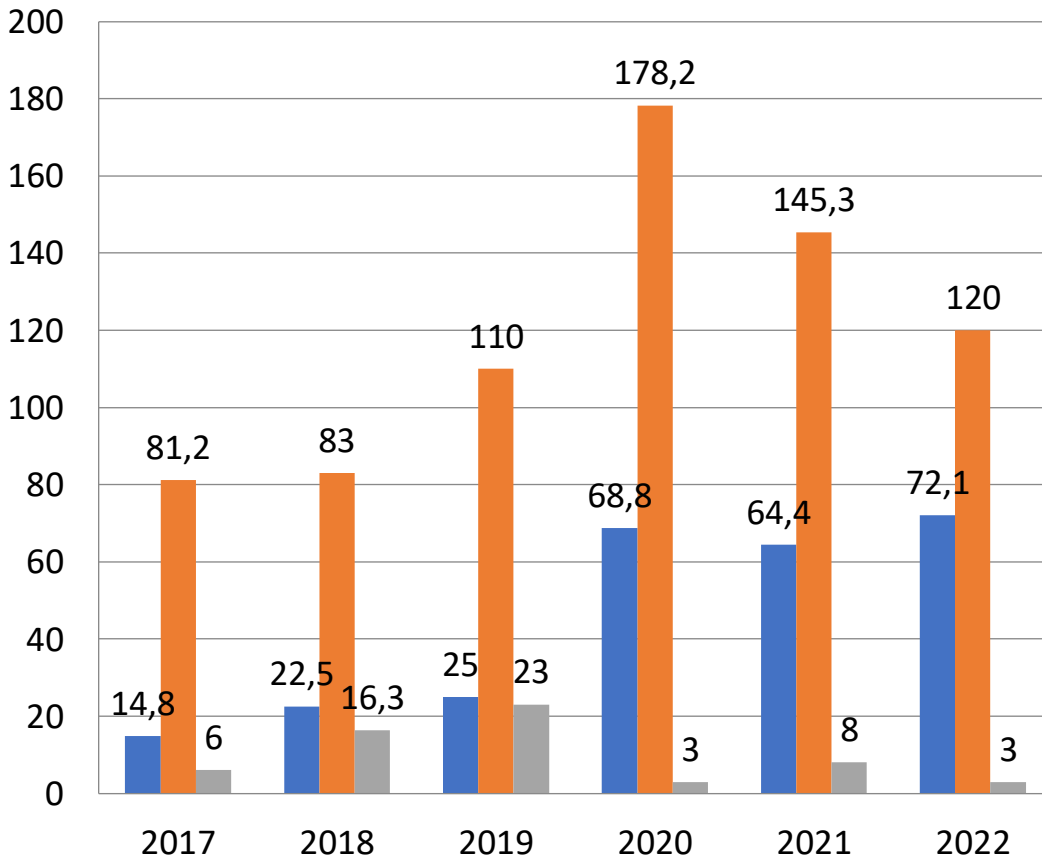
These organisations are identified on certain criteria's such as: 1) registration, 2) accountability, 3) management and 4) a memorandum of understanding. Individuals and organisations bring all their donated items to us to be sorted in gender, size and age. Broken items will be fixed and dirty items will be cleaned. If these organisations are in need of any items they will put in an order, after which they will come and pick the correct size, gender and proper items according to their order. Minimum wastage occurs and the exact need is being fulfilled.

The need for “long life food” were identified and started the food bank. This is food that can be stored outside a fridge as most of the poor and needy has no electricity or fridges. This food is distributed among organisations, churches and individuals who have no food or a shortage there off.

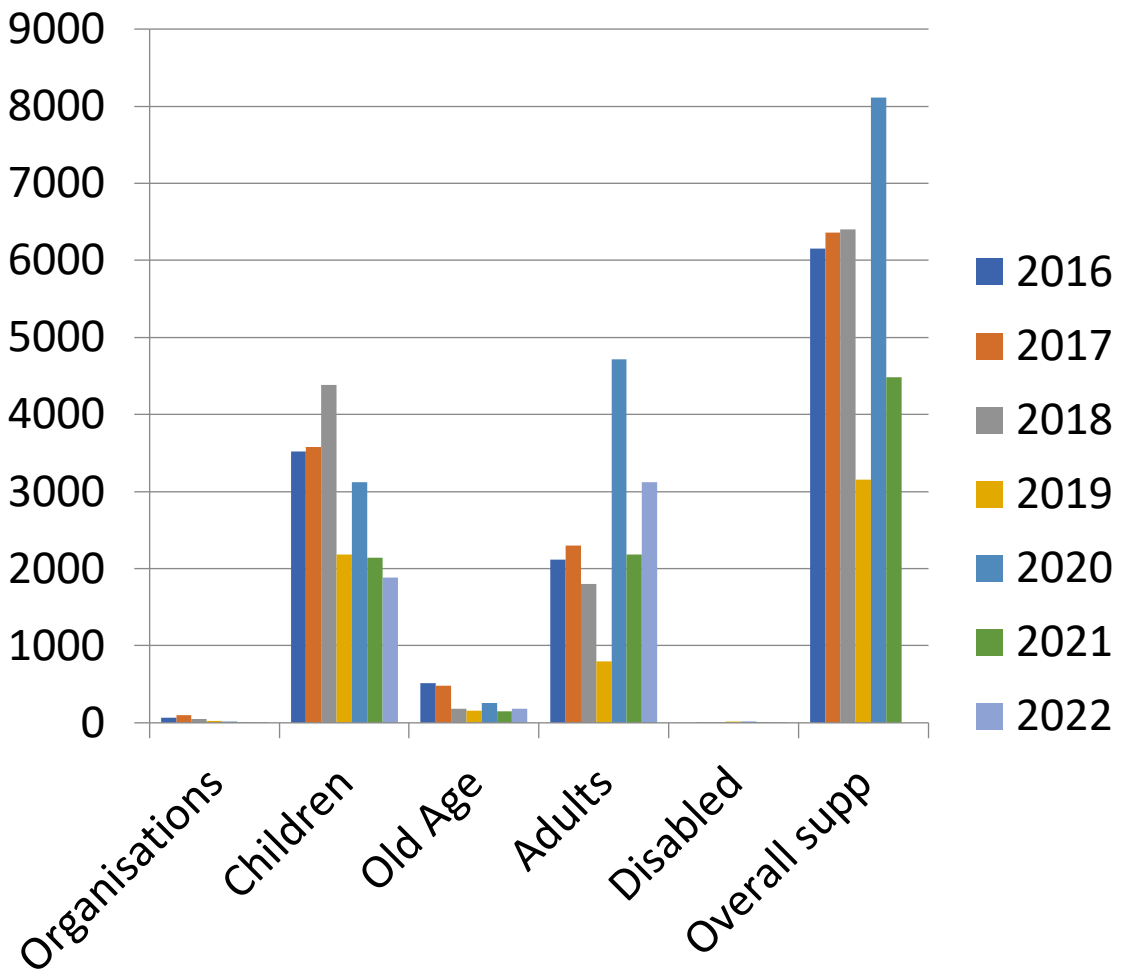

OPERATION

We have 6 major projects a year for which it takes a whole year to collect all the items for each project.

The projects are: 1) The blanket and jacket project in the winter; 2) the soft toy project for the cancer patients at National Hospital during December; 3) the toy project for day care centres and farm schools; 4) Street Store in partnership;

In 2022 we handed out 500 blankets and 2 500 jackets. The jackets and blankets are handed out in the very poor areas of Bloemfontein. The soft toy project we hand out soft toys with a sweet in the cancer halls of the National Hospital.

Pregnancy Crisis CENTRE



OPERATION

Pregnancy Crisis Centre of Hope (PCC) was established as a centre providing information and counseling to pregnant ladies and couples. Currently, PCC serves about 35 ladies per month by providing pre and post abortion counseling. Sexual Education are provided to Schools for pupils ages 11 -19.

Abortion statics shows 21.6 Million unsafe abortions in 2008 worldwide. In direct response to the growing number, PCC aims to equip pregnant woman and couples to make an informed decision. An unplanned pregnancy leave woman in a desperate situation whereby there are sometimes little or no support from the father of the baby. Because most of the women are still in school or studying, future prospects looks demoralizing to them. Through relationship building and establishing trust, PCC offers assistance to mothers who decide to keep their babies.

The Pregnancy Centre is very blessed to be in the position to help women that are in crisis. New clients for the year from January to December 2022 is 510. New clients refer to women coming to the centre for the first time. Then services provided from January to December 2022 is 3110 which includes follow up or women coming back for additional advice, sonar etc. Pre and post abortion counselling sessions are also done. The centre also does awareness programs in association with UFS and UCT and have a school program currently running at Bloemfontein High School.

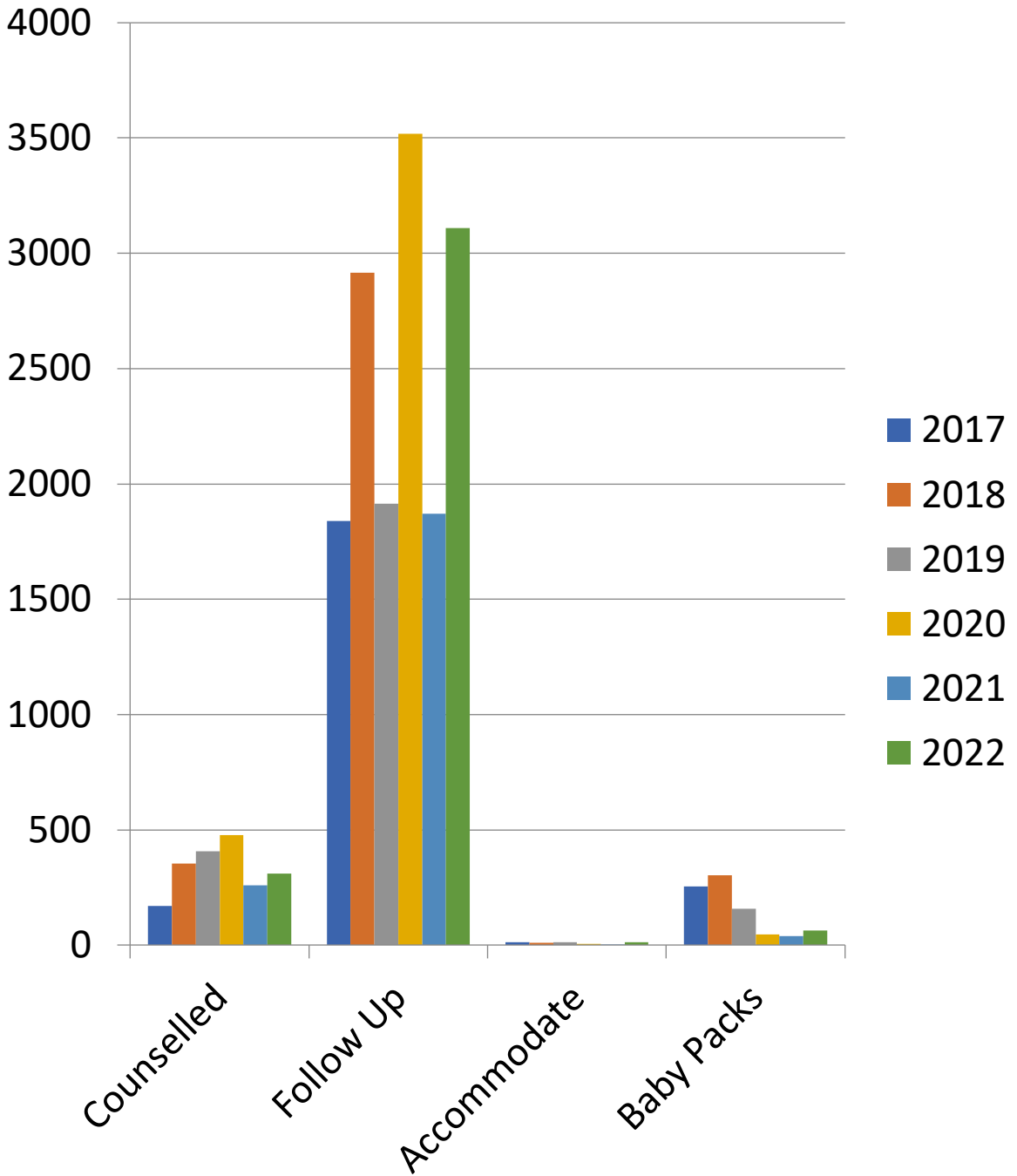
The need for a house was identified where we could temporary house pregnant women and their babies after birth. As a high percentage of the pregnant women are students we can offer them temporary accommodation whilst studying and also daycare after birth. Through this we can assist women and give them and their children hope and a future. In March 2015 we opened our house for mothers in crisis, with the counseling center situated next door. During 2022 TWELVE girls were accommodated at the house.

All girls are supported with pre and post natal care. Girls are reunited with their families and if adoption or foster care is considered the girls are referred to relevant institutions. We partner with doctors to do sonar's, Estherea Women's Wellness Clinic for pre -natal classes and sonar's, House Elpizo for foster care, ENGO for adoptions and Department of Social Development for assistance with social workers and issues.

The centre is operated as a sub- division of Anchor of Hope Ministries. In this the centre qualifies as an NPO under the NPO number of Anchor of Hope and also has tax benefits for all donors as Anchor of Hope is also Article 18(A) registered.

Currently Anchor of Rest employs 5 people in the making of couches and the upholstery of bus seats. We are currently making 20 couches – 1, 2 and 3 seaters and corner couches per month. The employment figure is determined by the orders. We have recently added Corporate gifts to our product range and we are currently making gifts for FORD which they give to each client that buys a new FORD vehicle.

The profit we make is ploughed back into Anchor of Hope to create financial stab also for the financial sustainability of the organisation.

Creating a financial stable environment for Anchor of Hope is very important to continue making a difference and impact on the economy, community and needs of people. By not be dependable upon donors and making the shift from unsustainable to a sustainable organisation makes the possibility of growth and impact for Anchor a reality.

We also sub contract work out to other NPO's such as the scatter pillows on the couches.

- To impact the immediate community through various outreach projects to the surrounding communities.

CURRENT

During 2021 we decided that the house is more than a shelter, it is an upliftment centre for men without hope. Men from different background, age and race enter the house from a place of no hope and we decided to uplift them through descent housing, proper food, emotional counselling and a job creation project we are running. The job creation consists of partnerships with different organisations whereby low level security , parking assistants and cleaning of municipal and public areas for neighbourhood associations such as Westdene Association. We have also signed a contract for refuge removal. Some of these men has been placed successfully back into society through our upliftment program. We can house according to health standards 35 men at a time.

Nuwe begin vir skulding

“Die plek het heeltemal ’n metamorfose ondergaan. Nou is dit baie meer ’n tydelike huis as net ’n plek om te oornag.”

So gesels Harnet Jackson, ’n inwoner wat sedert Mel in die manskulding in Hilton woon, wat nou die nuut ingerigte Lighthouse Centre of Hope-manskulding is.

Boeta Swart se liefdadigheidsorganisasie Anchor of Hope het die ingelope vier maande ingegryp en die plek ’n godsantverwysing laat ondergaan, asook hoop gebring aan mense wat dit baie nodig het.

Die manskulding, wat Vir Jare ’n regte naam in die stad gehad het, gaan voortaan onder beskerming van Anchor of Hope funksioneer.

Swart se eke man wat in die middag na die huis kom en sy vrou vir ’n bed, stort en bord kos betaal, moet alkohol- en dwelmyntes. Geen moelheidsmakers sal hulle word nie.

Op ’n geselligheid op 9 Oktober het daar te beddens vir 35 mans, maar vyf enkelbed matrasse kort.

Hy se toe hulle met die opknappwerk begin het, het hulle agt vragte van 12 ton elk van die huis af weggegrui.

“Ons het skenkings gekry en al die mure geverf, teëls in die kombuis en badkamers geleë, nuwe sanitêre ware gekry en splinternuwe sonverhittingselsels laat aanbring,” se Swart.

Hy se Anchor of Hope het ook ’n bydrae gemaak, maar sakesel het behoort hul hart oopgemaak. Die hele huis se bedrading is oorgeleë en nuwe ligte is aangebring.

Eindek is verbeterings van ongeveer R450 000 aan die huis gedoen.

Die grootste verandering is egter dat behoorlike bestuur en ’n nuwe administratiewe stelsel toegepas word.

“Dié het maar rof gegaan hier,” se Henrie Klopper (70), die oudste inwoner, wat reeds drie jaar in die huis woon.

“Noudat Boeta en sy span betrokke is, is alles kalm en veilig. Die groot probleme met die dwelms is ook nou eets van die verlede.”

Swart se hulle probeer om vir al die inwoners werk te kry sodat hulle hul lewensgehalte kan verbeter en hulle ’n eie woonplek kan bekostig. Hy se van die mans kan ook insake by Anchor of Hope se skoonmaakspanne wat sakesel se persele in die stad skoonmaak.

“Lighthouse Centre moet egter meer wees as net ’n blyplek vir hawelose mans. Dit moet ook ’n plek wees wat die gemeenskap help.”

There are 9 000 000 girls in South Africa between the ages of 13 and 19.

This is the school going age of menstruating girls.

Their Education is hindered by 25%, as these girls do not go to school whilst they are menstruating as they have no access to sanitary wear.

That is one week every month, which is a massive set back in their school careers. If there is money in the family it first goes to food.

The sanitation in the schools is mostly dismal, if not of a very low standard, which makes it extremely difficult for girls to discard used sanitary pads.

The majority of the workers that migrate into the city to work as domestics or at markets or anywhere they choose, all have the same problem of the cost and disposal of sanitary pads.

The monthly cycle of a woman should be something to celebrate and not to dread.

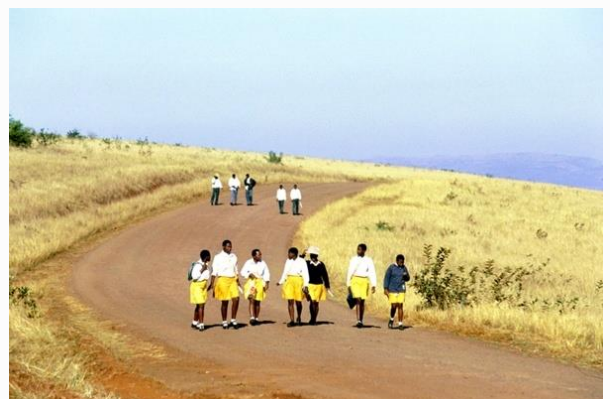
This is a normal part of any woman's life which should not impede her progress through life.

However, some methods of menstrual hygiene employed in developing countries include:

- Packets tied around the body filled with sand and leaves,
- Waste paper
- News paper
- Old cloths
- Rags
- Previously soiled and dried sanitary pads – if they have any not always their own

It is extremely concerning that young ladies miss up to a week of school each month when they menstruate. This certainly hinders their education and sets them back, putting them at a clear disadvantage against their male counterparts.

Education is the future for our county. Women deserve better.

Esther is a project that focus on broken and hopeless women and young girls. Dignity, hope and worthiness is established in each of them through our job creation project where washable sanitary towels are made and distributed among girls who cannot afford it.

- To equip and inform girls about there unique biological bodies

- According to national statistics SA have almost 6 888 910 girls between the ages of 13 - 16 yrs old that does not have direct access to sanitary wear due to financial restraints.
- The effect is that these girls do not attend school due to their menstrual cycle and they are absent 12 weeks per year = 3 months a year
- This causes a direct impact on our pass rates, emotional stability and social welfare of the communities.

2) HEALTH

- Sanitary pads and tampons can be a serious health risk.
- The sanitary products that we use are made with chemicals that enter the body through the skin and can cause cancer over time.
- To kill the unbearable and unpleasant smell of the menstrual blood deodorants and perfumes are added to the pad. The scented pads can interfere in your embryonic development in which your fertility gets affected.
- Then there is the side where sanitary pads are not available to girls due to certain factors and these girls use plastic bags, cow dung and even mud.

3) COST EFFECTIVENESS

- On average a household with one girl spends up to R600.00 a year on disposable sanitary towels. That is R1200.00 over two year cycle
- Our washable sanitary towels if looked after can last up to **TWO YEARS** at R270/ kit.
- That is a saving of R330.00/girl in her first cycle of two years and another R330.00/girl in her second cycle.
- This is a saving of R27.50 per girl/household/month
- If a company decides to sponsor 200 girls it will save a community R66 000.00/year

4) GREENHOUSE EFFECT

- We have a holistic approach to this matter pertaining to the environment and consequently we want to ensure that every aspect imparting on the environment is taken into account.
- An average woman in SA uses 16,000 or more pads or tampons in her lifetime. That's 437500 women x 16,000 = 7 billion pads and tampons landing on landfills.
- Most of them contains chemicals and toxins additives and synthetic material such as plastic.
- The plastic takes about 500 years to breakdown.
- They also end up polluting our rivers, lakes and sea.
- Alternatives to disposable sanitary towels are the reusable pads which are made out of fabrics which are biodegradable.

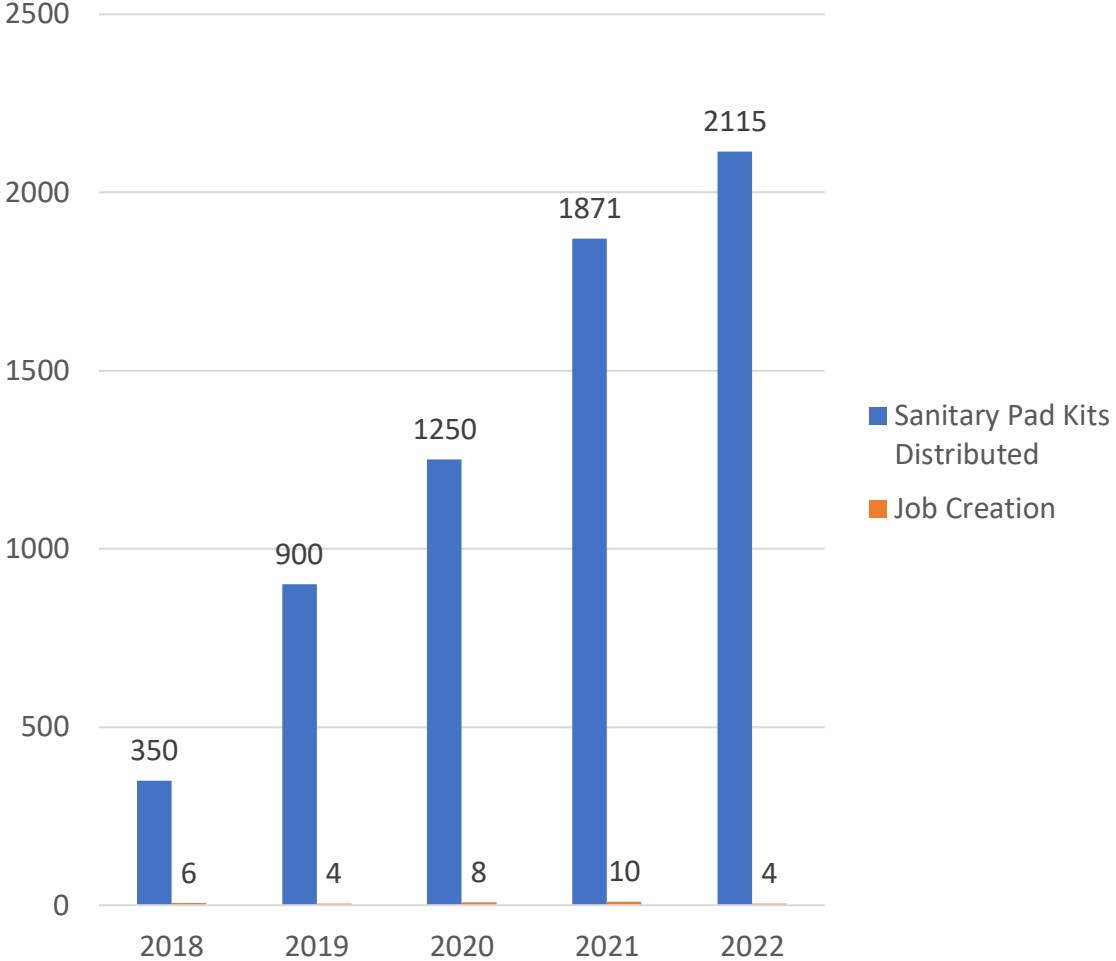
- Dignity is the one aspect that changes the social landscape of any country. A girl without dignity caused by shame, low self esteem and unworthiness leads to low social and moral values.
- These low values leads to unplanned pregnancies, sexual violence and misconduct AND substance abuse.



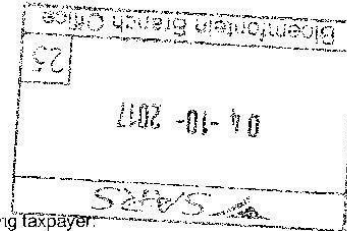


