
# Introduction

Anchor of Hope was established on the 23rd of March 2009 and is a non-profit umbrella organization.

It consists of 8 projects each aimed at a specific need in the community. Projects focus on upliftment, development, restoring dignity and humanity, and providing a sense of worthiness and purpose. This is achieved by providing clothing, nonperishable food and support services through a network of organisations, projects, feeding schemes, counselling, awareness programs, pregnancy home, men's shelter and job preparation (and creation) projects.

Our vision is to expand our footprint nationwide with contributions of National Companies.

Eight pillars of social impact receive our specific attention. These are: partnerships, welfare, skills development, the environment, individuals with disabilities, women, education and job creation

#### PREGNANCY CRISIS

A project helping women dealing with unwanted or unplanned pregnancies. Providing counselling and temporary accommodation for mothers and newborn babies. Pre- and postabortion counselling is provided where needed.

#### MEN'S SHELTER

A men's shelter tocusing on the restoration and rehabilitation of men living on the streets

#### TRAINING PROJECTS

A project transforming lives and uplift individuals to impact their world through skills development.

### CONTINOUS PROJECTS

Food and clothing to the poor, to other organisations and to feeding schemes. Includes providing community and social upliftment through projects alongside government. Institutions

### **CARPENTRY & UPHOLSTERY**

A factory providing high quality furniture and corporate gifts through training and mentorship to previously unemployed individuals.

#### COMMUNITY INFRASTRUCTURE

Unemployed individuals contribute to a safe and clean environment as they are employed to clean streets and parks; fix potholes; aid in refuse removal and serve as parking attendants;

### SEWING

Unemployed women are trained in manufacturing washable sanitary pads, overalls, scrubs and aprons. Sanitary pads are distributed to female scholars and other institutions.

Handing out 1 4000 clothing pieces in partnership with other churches and organisations.



Care boxes which contain the bare necessities for the homeless arriving at organisations & churches.



Painting and maintaining public parks in partnership with Doxa Deo Church and Courant.



Offer support to 3 local churches in Botswana, Lesotho and Zimbabwe.






# Continuous Projects

Food and clothing bank -

This important project centralises food and clothing stores in the Bloemfontein area to reduce waste and increase social impact. The primary objective of this central store is to manage all non-profit organisations' donations in an efficient manner. Our process includes sorting and arranging clothing according to size, gender and quality. Other services include storing, cleaning, fixing and general stock control of bedding, furniture and toy donations. Other organisations then register with Anchor of Hope, order supplies as needed and collect from this combined store



The warehouse also stocks furniture, kitchenware, bedding, non-perishable foods, school clothes and stationery.



# Pregnancy Crisis Centre Pregnancy Crisis Of HOPE

The Pregnancy Crisis Centre of Hope (PCC) was established in 2013 to focus on women dealing with unwanted or unplanned pregnancies.

PCC equips pregnant women to make informed decisions.

The centre currently serves an estimated 3 5 w o m e n p e r m o n t h by providing a safe environment, counselling and temporary accommodation for them and their new-born babies.

All women are supported with pre- and post-natal care, counselling, emotional support and all relevant information.

Where women consider adoption or foster care, they provide referral to the relevant registered institutions

Other services offered: (1) limited sonars, (2) pregnancy tests, (3) abstinence programs for schools, (4) pre-and postabortion counseling and (5) training of counsellors.

PCC partners with various doctors, the Estherea Women's Wellness Clinic (for pre-natal classes and sonars), El Pizo House of Hope (for foster care), ENGO (for adoptions) and the Department of Social Development (for social services).

This a shelter that focuses on the rehabilitation of men living on the streets.

The main objective is to uplift and counsel these men, while re-establishing life skills through various programs and projects and to re-establish them to contribute economically and socially.

Men with addictions are rehabilitated by being placed at or referred to qualified and registered rehabilitation centres. Various job creation projects ensures that these individuals are reintroduced to their community, while being uplifted through renewed or added skills.

Cycle Kits

There are 9 000 000 girls in South Africa between the ages of 13 and 19.

This is the school going age of menstruating girls.

### GIRLS' EDUCATION IS HINDERED BY

as these girls do not go to school whilst they are menstruating as they have no access to sanitary wear.

We focus on the dignity and sanitary provision to these young scholars through the manufacturing of washable sanitary pads which are supplied to scholars by means of **cycle kits**.
